Power Profiler: Alicia Keys

Alicia Keys is a 15-time GRAMMY® Award-winning artist, songwriter, actress, and New York Times bestselling author.

A classically trained pianist, Keys began composing songs by age 12 and was signed at 15 years old by Columbia Records. After disputes with the label, she signed with Arista Records and later released her debut album, Songs in A Minor, with J Records in 2001. The album was critically and commercially successful, selling over 12 million copies worldwide. It spawned the Billboard Hot 100 number-one single "Fallin'", and earned Keys five Grammy Awards in 2002. Her second album, The Diary of Alicia Keys (2003), was also a critical and commercial success, selling



eight million copies worldwide, and produg the singles **"You Don't Know My Name"**, **"If I Ain't Got You"**, and **"Diary**." The album garnered her an additional four Grammy Awards.

In 2004, her duet "My Boo" with Usher became her second numberone single. Keys released her first live album, Unplugged (2005), and became the first woman to have an MTV Unplugged album debut at number one. Her third album, As I Am (2007), sold seven million copies worldwide and produced the Hot 100 number-one single "No One". In 2007, Keys made her film debut in the action-thriller film Smokin' Aces. She released the theme song to the James Bond film Quantum of Solace "Another Way to Die" with Jack White.
